3.Teamwork: Players are expected to collaborate well with their peers, contributing to team unity and supporting each other both on and off the field.


4.Skill Development: Regular attendance at training is essential for improving individual skills, as well as contributing to overall team success. The focus is on continued progress, no matter the player's starting level.




