Questions to Ask Your Child About a Book

Talking to your children about the books they read is one of the best ways to support your child's literacy development. Your child needs to engage in critical thinking to discuss a book — a key skill for success in school as well as life. Here are some tips on how to start and sustain a book discussion with your child:

Before your child reads a book, ask:

- •Why did you select this book?
- •What makes you think this book is going to be interesting?
- •What do you think the book is going to be about?

After your child has finished a book, ask questions such as:

- •What was your favorite part of the book? Why?
- •Who was your favorite character? Why?
- •What was the most interesting thing you learned from the book?
- •Why do you think the author wrote this book?
- •Would you have ended the book differently? Did it end the way you thought it would?

While your child is reading a book, try asking:

- •Will you catch me up on the story? What's happened so far?
- •What do you think will happen next?
- If you were that character, what would you have done differently in that situation?
- •Where is the book set?
- Did you learn any new words or facts so far?

Year 7 students have been immersing themselves in problemsolving tasks related to writing prompts, while refining their non-fiction writing skills through biography projects.


Our Year 8 students continue to delve into *The Tempest*, and many are looking forward to attending a live performance of the play next week.

In Year 9, students have produced impressive blackout poetry, showcasing their creativity and analytical skills.


Finally, our Year 10 and 11 students have started working diligently on their coursework, making significant progress as they prepare for upcoming assessments.




















Y7's and Y8's have been working on Algebra this week, and Ms Griffin's class finished the week with a jigsaw to practice Collecting Like Terms!

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





"The angle with 134 degrees is corresponding with angle on line U so that is 134 degrees. 180-134 = 46 for the angle next to it, inside the triangle.

180-132 = 48 degrees for the other base angle. 46+48 = 94.

Angles in a triangle add up to 180 so 180 -94 = x x=86"












SCIENCE UPDATES

Our French Year 7 students have been exploring Countries and have completed student-led learning tasks to research their findings. They used a range of resources to gather their findings.








MSC Update – Mr Altaf

Year 8 MSC students showcased impressive skills in First Aid, engaging in thoughtful discussions about their moral responsibilities and exploring ways to positively impact local communities.














Psychology Update – Mr Wood


