Dear Islamic Studies Parents,


Greetings from the Islamic Department and welcome to South View School! We would like to share with you the latest updates from the Islamic classes:

- The students worked together to tackle new structures that they can then use in their spoken and written Spanish.



Our Year 7 language students have been developing their vocabulary range and have started to talk about their likes and dislikes in French and more complex introductions in Spanish.






