10 TOP TIPS FOR PARENTS TO SUPPORT CHILDREN TO READ



Literacy Update – Louise

Encourage your child to read

Reading helps your child's wellbeing, develops imagination and has educational benefits too. Just a few minutes a day can have a big impact on children of all ages. You can encourage them by reading yourself. Have books available, magazines and newspapers. Perhaps you could read together.

Encourage reading choice

Give children lots of opportunities to read different things in their own time - it doesn't just have to be books. There's fiction, non-fiction, poetry, comics, magazines, recipes and much more. Try leaving interesting reading material in different places around the home and see who picks it up. If your home is less tidy (it's hard with kids!) – have a dedicated space for books so they can always be found.

Create a comfortable environment

Make a calm, comfortable place for your family to relax and read independently - or together.

Talk about books

This is a great way to make connections, develop understanding and make reading even more enjoyable. Start by discussing the front cover and talking about what it reveals and suggests the book could be about. Then talk about what you've been reading and

- Read aloud regularly

This often happens as young children. We often stop when they are at secondary school. There is, however, no reason to stop. Why not ask them what book they are reading and they could read a passage with you, or to you. They could even read to a sibling.

Read together



- This is a great chance for both students and parents to gather valuable insights and ask questions about higher education pathways. We encourage everyone to attend and make the most of this informative event.






Spelling Bee Finals – Winners Announcement



(1) What are they for?

Humanities Update -Business & Economics




Year 10 Business Studies – Students are beginning their study of the External Environment, focusing on how economic, legal, political, social, and technological factors influence businesses and decision-making.


Year 11 BTEC Business – We have started Unit 4, the final unit of the course, which focuses on Market Planning.

Year 13 BTEC Business – Students are continuing their study of the Principles of Management and Ethics units.






Year 8s practising their spoken language by conducting a survey about their food likes and dislikes.


Some fantastic pronunciation and showing their phonics work in a practical way. Well done!







Some students created presentations, while others created comic strips or mini-films.






Sports Day 2025 – Wednesday, 12th February

Can anyone dethrone last year's winners, **Ignis**? Let's bring the energy, teamwork, and sportsmanship to make this year's event unforgettable!






TERM 2A
