<u>Title: George</u> Author: Frieda Hughes

Genre: Memoir

The reader follows the journey of George and Frieda, from the moment George falls from his nest to when he flies away for the last time. Using trypsin to break down casein, a protein found in milk, they measured reaction rates with a colourimeter, gaining hands-on experience in enzyme kinetics and the role of pH in biochemical processes.



Islamic Update – Mr. Kerba

Assalamu Alaikum Dear Parents,

We hope this message finds you well. As we conclude Assessment Week in Islamic Studies, we wanted to thank you every one for the hardworking and support.

This week, students from each year group completed assessments covering the key topics we've explored so far this term. These assessments were designed to evaluate their understanding of core concepts, memorization of essential verses or Duas, and ability to reflect on Islamic values and practices. We are pleased to share the Islamic Studies topics that each year group will be exploring next week. These lessons have been selected to deepen students' understanding of key Islamic concepts and to encourage personal growth and reflection.

Topics for Next Week:

•Year 7: — حاسبوا أنفسكم Reflecting on self-accountability in Islam, students will learn the importance of examining their actions and intentions, fostering personal responsibility in light of Islamic principles.

•Year 8: — التوبة فرصة العرب Focusing on the theme of repentance, students will discuss how seeking Allah's forgiveness is a priceless opportunity to renew their hearts and actions.

•Year 9: — التقرب إلى الله تعالى Emphasizing ways to draw closer to Allah, this lesson will cover acts of worship, kindness, and sincerity as means of building a stronger connection to faith.

•Year 10: — الحلال بيّن) This topic will help students understand the clear distinctions in Islam between what is lawful (halal) and unlawful (haram), promoting ethical decision-making in daily life.

•Year 11: — (سورة الكهف الجزء الثاني) •Students will continue exploring the second part of Surah Al-Kahf, reflecting on the wisdom and lessons it offers for navigating life's challenges with faith.

•Year 12: — غزوة الأحزاب In this historical study, students will examine the Battle of the Trench (Ghazwat Al-Ahzab) and draw lessons in resilience, unity, and trust in Allah's support.

•Year 13: — (سورة النور) حطة وعبرة وعبرة وعبرة النور Focusing on the story of the slander incident (Hadith al-Ifk) in Surah An-Nur, students will learn valuable moral lessons, understanding how this story imparts wisdom in patience, trust, and faith.
