
Academic Update - Mrs Stevens






Literacy Update - Louise

English Update - Mr. Archibald

As the term comes to a close, we're pleased to share the highlights from the English Department.

Year 7 focused on *identity* in literature, exploring characterisation and self-expression, while also developing their poetic skills. Year 8 studied *The Tempest*, with a trip to see the play performed live, alongside exploring short stories and improving their creative writing. Year 9 engaged with both poetry and the dystopian genre, analysing language and themes while developing critical thinking skills. Year 10 began their International GCSE course, covering novel study, non-fiction texts, and poetry to build a strong foundation in critical reading and analysis. Year 11 have been preparing for their International GCSE exams, focusing on literature analysis, essay writing, and exam strategies.

Looking ahead, next term promises exciting activities such as the Spelling Bee, speaking-focused lessons, and celebrations for World Book Day.

English Update - Mr. Archibald

Here is a great Shakespearian sonnet by Amogh (Year 7). The poem captures the delicate balance between nature's beauty and humanity's tendency to overlook or damage it. Amogh uses rich imagery, such as "a picturesque wave of vibrant crystal," to describe a pristine natural world, yet the poem also reflects a deeper concern about human ignorance and the harm caused by mankind's actions. The sonnet concludes with a somber note about the consequences of this blindness, urging a recognition of nature's worth before it's too late. Amogh's thoughtful exploration of these themes in a traditional sonnet form is a compelling example of how classic poetry can address modern concerns.

He does not realize that he hurts her


The beauty of nature's gem must be saved

Mathematics Update – Ms Griffin





The Arts Update - Mrs Rock


Wow! What a term!


TERM 2A
