
Y7 have been working Fractions, Decimals and Percentages so far this term.

Ms Griffin's class investigated the prompt



Year 12 – The students have been exploring Unit 12 content Assignment briefs to be handed next week.



Year 9 Taster Lesson: Exploring Economics and the Basic Economic Problem by Mr Sa Nogueira

This week, I had the pleasure of introducing Year 9 students to the exciting world of Economics during their taster lessons. The session focused on one of the most fundamental concepts in the subject: **the basic economic problem**—how we balance limited resources against unlimited wants.

The students showed incredible curiosity and engagement as we discussed real-world examples of scarcity and decision-making. It was inspiring to see how quickly they grasped key ideas, such as opportunity cost and resource allocation, and applied them to everyday scenarios.

One highlight of the lesson was a group activity where students debated how a fictional country should allocate its scarce resources. Their creativity and critical thinking skills shone through as they presented innovative solutions and well-reasoned arguments.

It was truly a privilege to teach such bright and enthusiastic learners. If this session is any indication, the future of our Economics classes looks very promising! I look forward to welcoming these students into the subject next year and guiding them through the fascinating study of how the world works.

Thank you, Year 9, for making this taster lesson such an enjoyable and rewarding experience. Keep up the great work!




MFL Update - Ms. O'Sullivan

This year, we have focused on the acting skills of our fantastic students' and you will not be disappointed.




