Literacy Update - Louise

As we approach the month of October, our students will be engaging in a range of activities during Thursday's tutor time to help them develop their oracy skills. Throughout the month we'll be reflecting on the role listening and speaking play in oracy, and how you can support your children to become great listeners and communicators.

What is oracy?

Oracy is all about how we talk and listen to others. The Oracy Framework can help you figure out which speaking and listening skills you need in different situations. It breaks these skills down into four strands: physical, linguistic, cognitive, and social-emotional.



Physical: this strand is about how you use your body and voice when you talk. It includes things like your gestures, body language, and how you change your voice to express emotions or speak louder or faster.



Linguistic: this is about the words and phrases you choose to use and how you put them together when you speak.



Cognitive: this strand is about how you organise your thoughts, explain your ideas clearly, and ask questions to better understand things.



Social & Emotional: this is about how you connect with others, take turns speaking, and make sure everyone feels heard and understood.



Literacy Update - Louise

Next week in tutor, our students will take on challenge 1: Listening to understand.

This is an exciting, engaging and low stakes way of encouraging effective talk and listening amongst our pupils.

Challenge 1 Listening to understand

When you don't fully understand what someone is saying, asking questions can help you figure out exactly what they mean. This helps you avoid making wrong guesses that could lead to misunderstandings. By asking questions, you can ensure you get the correct information and understand someone better.




Sit back-to-back with a friend. Ask your friend to draw a detailed picture of a fantasy creature, but don't look at their drawing!

As they describe the creature to you, try to draw the same creature on your paper.

While your friend is describing the creature, ask questions to help you understand its features and details more clearly. When you've finished your drawing, compare it with your friend's picture to see how closely it matches.

Since you can't see your friend or their drawing, you'll need to pay close attention to what they're saying. Ask clarifying questions like, 'are the wings on the creature's back feathered or scaled?' or 'ls the creature's tail long and slender, or short and bushy?' These kinds of questions will help you capture the details more accurately and get your drawing to match theirs better.




English Update Mr. Archibald

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



SCIENCE UPDATES







Lastly, our Year 9 Chemistry students are exploring the concept of diffusion by conducting experiments that demonstrate how it occurs in both liquids and gases. They have observed diffusion in liquids using potassium permanganate and in gases through the reaction between concentrated ammonia and concentrated hydrochloric acid, forming a visible ammonium chloride ring, which highlights how particles spread and mix over time.


The Arts Update - Mrs Rock


Well done to Luna in 7B who was our first secondary student of the year to perform at Tunes 4 Tuesday.


