As a learning support tool we encourage all of our learners to utilise the Atom online portal. Your child has a log in for the platform from their class teacher. They have assigned curriculum tasks to complete that incorporate English, maths and science. If you are unable to complete at home there is opportunity for your child to complete in school.

What a week of fun it has been in primary this week!

In year 5, the children have been learning all about decimals through fractions and percentages using the digital counters on Maths Bot! Year 2 had so much fun with numicon and counters learning how to divide by 5 and 10. Year 3 are enjoying their new topic of fractions as they explored denominators, numerators of non-unit fractions and comparing and ordering fractions. Keep up your hard work on TTRS; we will be awarding prizes at the end of term 2 in assemblies!

Across the younger years, science lessons have been filled with investigations about properties of materials and discussing why things are grouped as they are according to their properties. Year 3 have started their journey into photosynthesis while Year 4 are researching the difference between decibels and vibrations. Year 5 are also studying materials though starting to separate materials and Year 6 are investigating Light and how it travels. Our KS2 students have been immersed in identifying and exploring language in their writing lessons, with Year 5 exploring a diary entry of a viking and year 4 examining the structural features of a recipe. Our younger students in KS1 were thrilled to orally rehearse stories and have been busy bees learning new sounds in phonics lessons. Students are looking forward to the World Book Day celebrations on the 7th of March, watch this space!
