PE and Swimming

Highlight of the week: Y3 to Y6 topic assessment

The KS2 students had their topic assessment this week, to measure the progress and abilities of students in netball (girls), football (boys) and swimming (girls & boys). In PE, students had the opportunity to apply the learned skills into a formal game situation. In swimming, we analyzed the 4 strokes techniques with focus on side breathing (front crawl), backstroke body position, breaststroke and dolphin kick technique.

Throughout this week the children across the primary school have been very active in concluding many of their topics and learning from the first half term.

In science lessons, Year 1 were continuing their investigations and discussions around animals and the features of different animals. They still had lots to say after our pet visitors last week! Year 2 were checking on their plants and debating the ideal conditions needed for their seeds to grow into healthy plants. This investigation will continue over the half term break. Year 3 were using physical exercise to measure their femur bones and then see how far they could jump! Year 4 were finalising their electrical games designs to be finished after half term. Year 5 were also continuing their plant propagation and measuring their results. Finally, Year 6 created their fossils to investigate the changes in evolution and inheritance.

In maths this week, our primary parents put their critical thinking hats on in our parent workshop about supporting your child with maths at home. Year 3 have been consolidating their learning of place value by beginning to reason in greater depth using iPads. Our maths champions have been working hard communicating all about Barvember which is approaching fast being celebrated for the whole month of November. In English this week our Reading buddies in Years 3-6 were thrilled to listen to their younger peers read their books, providing them with support whilst also developing their own communication skills.
