PE and swimming during the Holy Month of Ramadan:

Students that are fasting will not take part in practical PE or swimming. They will instead be provided with theory activities related with the topic that we are developing in the practical lessons.

Y3 to Y6 fasting students should bring their own device to PE and swimming, notebook and pencil.

Article of interesse: The importance of learn to swim

Water Safety: Reduces the risk of drowning. Learning to swim provides individuals with essential water safety skills and how to handle emergency situations.

Life-saving Skills: In situations where there is a risk of drowning, the ability to swim can be life-saving. Individuals who can swim are better equipped to navigate such situations, potentially saving their own lives or the lives of others.

Health and Fitness: Swimming is an excellent form of exercise that offers a full-body workout. It helps to improve cardiovascular health, strength, flexibility, and endurance.

Recreation and Enjoyment: Swimming opens up opportunities for recreational activities and it's a skill that can provide lifelong enjoyment and relaxation.

Confidence Building: Overcoming the fear of water and mastering the skill of swimming can boost self-confidence and self-esteem.

Social Opportunities: Learning to swim allows individuals to participate in social activities (swim teams, joining water-based clubs, or simply swimming with friends) and fosters a sense of camaraderie and belonging.

As a learning support tool we encourage all of our learners to utilise the Atom online portal. Your child has a log in for the platform from their class teacher. They have assigned curriculum tasks to complete that incorporate English, maths and science. If you are unable to complete at home there is opportunity for your child to complete in school.

What an exciting week it has been for maths in SVS! We had our fun maths activities running each morning on the quad facilitated by our primary maths champions and secondary mathematicians. Everyone did an incredible job at answering the various challenges at each station. Well done to year 4 who have won overall for answering the most challenges this week! Year 4 will attend a fun maths workshop with Miss Lyons after spring break. In our maths lessons we have had so much fun from capacity in year 3 to perimeter and area in year 5. Children have been exploring real-life problems and getting hands-on in their tasks!

The STEAM lab has been a hub of investigative excitement this week as year groups have been busy experimenting with different materials to find out whether certain useful classroom items are soluble, insoluble, dense or less dense. The Year 2 children had a lot of discussion with their findings and applied a lot of scientific information. Year 3 were lucky to visit the secondary Eco Garden in their discovery and classification of plants. Year 5 were also looking into materials though looking further at how reversible and irreversible changes in solutions and mixtures could or could not be changed. Year 6 have been investigating light absorption and how the colours in white light separate using different coloured lenses and acetate.

This week has been brimming with excitement and learning across all year groups in English! In Year 1, our little explorers have been diving into the world of descriptive language, using colorful adjectives to paint vivid pictures in their stories and describing their adventures with gusto. Year 2 has been on a thrilling journey through time and imagination with their topic "Towers, Tunnels, and Turrets." Inspired by their adventures, they've innovated captivating tales filled with mysterious discoveries. Meanwhile, in Year 3, our budding scholars have been honing their analytical skills by comparing and contrasting characters from their favorite stories, delving into the depths of personalities and motivations. Year 4 students have been mastering the art of punctuation, ensuring their sentences flow seamlessly and convey their ideas with clarity and precision. In Year 5, the focus has been on exploring the fascinating realms of fiction and non-fiction texts, uncovering the similarities and differences between the two and discovering what each genre offers. Finally, Year 6 scholars have been diving into the world of figurative language, identifying and using metaphors, similes, and other literary devices to add depth and richness to their writing. It's been an inspiring week filled with boundless creativity, and we can't wait to see where our students' curiosity and passion take them next!


