



As a learning support tool we encourage all of our learners to utilise the Atom online portal. Your child has a log in for the platform from their class teacher. They have assigned curriculum tasks to complete that incorporate English, maths and science. If you are unable to complete at home there is opportunity for your child to complete in school.

Throughout this week, our primary students have had lots of learning opportunities across the school with Barvember and the Spelling Bee being introduced supporting and maths and English lessons.

Science investigations have created a lot of discussion around the school particularly with our Year 3 children investigating properties of rocks and soils in the Primary Science Lab. Year 1 have explained the differences between herbivores and carnivores and found particular interest analysing differences between a shark and camel's teeth (not a real shark or camel unfortunately for the children). Year 5 continue their investigation and analysis of solar objects and why we rotate and orbit other planets. Year 6 have hypothesised further ideas around adaptations of living things and Year 2 are still busy deciding what groups to sort animals in and why need to do this to be an excellent scientist.

In English this week, Year 1 have been busy retelling the story 'How the leopard got his spots' using T4W actions, they enjoyed drawing the text map and writing words, and even sentences about the story! Year 3 discussed and explored the key features of a portal story, they really enjoyed language gathering and creating detailed character descriptions about the character Om using expanded noun phrases. Year 5 used varied sentences structures to

continue writing their stories & Year 6 developed their author voice through short burst writing. In Maths, we have had such an exciting week with the launch of Barvember! Children from EYFS to year 6 have been incorporating the bar model. in all of their maths lessons, particularly to visualise word problems.

We have weekly challenges for children to complete in class and White Rose daily challenges for children to complete on the quad each morning, at break and lunch. Stay tuned next week for a Barvember video of our exciting activities in SVS so far!
