### Mr. Webster's Highlights

Year 6 students have enjoyed another very busy and productive week. A lot of our week as been spent on STEAM week activities focusing on the work and life Charles Darwin. For Maths, we calculated the number of day the HMS Beagle took to travel around the world. We also mapped the major stop of the HMS Beagle on a World map.

For Art, we sketched some of the animals and insects that Darwin investigated, using the same style of drawing he used.

For Technology, some of our students used a Computer Aided Design program to design their own seafaring vessels.
