



Throughout this week, our primary learners have busy recapping their term 1 learning in a variety of engaging and exciting ways.

In science lessons in Key Stage 1, Year 1 have continued their learning with mastering descriptions of herbivores, carnivores and omnivores. Explanations and discussion have been a key part in their learning and the classrooms have been a buzz talking about features of lions, sharks, giraffes, dogs and various insects. Year 2 have been practising their recent study of plants with their various trips to Dubai Miracle garden. There were plenty of opportunities to discuss their knowledge and enjoy the colours, shapes and fragrances of all plants and flowers. Across Key Stage 2, we also had year group visits to Children's City in Year 4. Year 5 practised the cycles of the moon with Oreos. Year 3 modelled different rock formations with different materials and Year 6 concluded their topic about environments and the impact humans have on the planet.

In maths, we have had another exciting week of celebrating Barvember! We started our Barvember workshops to celebrate children who have consistently used the bar model in their maths lessons and shown a deep understanding of its usefulness in problem-solving. Watch our reel this week to see our EYFS, year 1 and 2 children in action! In EYFS, we are learning all about shape. In year 1, we have been learning how to subtract by crossing out and in year 2 we started learning how to add and subtract by crossing 10! In KS2 we have been consolidating our learning on the four operations as well as fractions. We have been busy mathematicians! Check your Seesaw messages for our final Barvember home learning challenge! Have fun!

In English lessons this week, children have been busy constructing and writing their own stories & information texts using a range of language and literary techniques to enhance their writing. Year 1 phonics sessions have kept children busy practicing their phonics sounds and using Fred Talk to sound out words and write short sentences. This week we had our fantastic camp read-a-lot where children were rewarded for passing their reading targets and achieving 100% of their Accelerated Reader targets. They thoroughly enjoy coming to school in their pyjamas, reading their favorite books and enjoying some marshmallows along the way!




Mrs. Barlow's Highlights
