#### Highlight of the week:

In Year 2, students have been learning about different throwing techniques using a variety of equipment. They also understand the difference between throwing for accuracy or throwing for distant and apply the best technique for it.

We use bean bags, foam javelins with different sizes and vortex (nerf ball). Overall, students had showed a preference for the vortex when throwing for distance because they reach further marks and also because when they apply a good technique the vortex makes a sound like a whistle.

As a learning support tool we encourage all of our learners to utilise the Atom online portal. Your child has a log in for the platform from their class teacher. They have assigned curriculum tasks to complete that incorporate English, maths and science. If you are unable to complete at home there is opportunity for your child to complete in school.

Term 2 is now in full swing with lots of exciting learning and discussion happening around the primary and FS school.

FS and Year 1 have opened their new Science Learning Hub in the EYFS Learning Garden. The children have been full of ideas and questions with their peers and teachers. There are also new plants that the children in FS have been lovingly taking care of.

Across Key Stage 1 the children have been busy in researching their knowledge and ideas around seasons and living things and varying habitats. Year 3 are creating their experiment about light and shadows and Year 4 delving into the world of particles of solids, liquids and gasses. Years 5+6 have been developing their understanding of physics by making parachutes and electrical circuits.

This week children in FS have been practicing learning new sounds in their phonics lessons. FS2 have been learning about questions and question marks and enjoyed doing some hot seating with the Giant and Jack in 'Jack and the beanstalk', where they learned how to ask questions to find answers. Year 3 children have been busy looking at features of newspaper reports and year 5 and 6 have been exploring descriptive language and studying persuasive language, where they enjoyed debating and persuading their peers to purchase their 'products' using persuasive language and phrases.

This week in maths in year 2, the children have been having lots of fun learning all about money. They are super excited for next week's learning where they will be adding values together! Year 6 finished up their topic on ratio while year 5 delved deeper into multiplication and division.
