



### **PE and Swimming**

Dear Parents and students,

This week in PE and swimming:

EYFS & KS1: Students had the opportunity to learn about the PE & swimming lessons routines and safety procedures. In swimming we have been focus on the baseline assessments to split the students in level of ability.

KS2: The girls have started Netball topic, with lessons focus on footwork and introducing/reviewing different types of passes. The boys have started Football topic, with lessons focus on dribbling and passing. In swimming the focus this week was on Backstroke technique.






### Miss Walker's Highlights






# Miss Dye's Highlights






