Technology is largely a wonderful thing. The ease of connecting people using technology and social vessels such as WhatsApp has been a progressive milestone in history. There are, however, dangers to this new and developing technology. Students can use technology to spread unpleasant communications and digital bullying is relatively new, yet widespread around the world. Inappropriate and hateful comments can exist online and it cannot be deleted - we see this in the public with celebrities, politicians etc all too frequently, and we raise this awareness with students and coach them around the pitfalls.

Hence, we teach our students to be careful what they post online. Unfortunately, emotions do not come across in texting (Emojis are not the same as hearing the emotion in a voice) and so students are told to think carefully before posting anything that is meant as a joke. We also warn them about 'Mob Mentality'. This occurs when one person writes a negative comment about another and then people like or add to it. They assume and adopt someone else's 'truth'. Soon enough, the whole group is acting as one, especially if the person is not in the group and cannot defend themselves.

We teach our students about Metacognition - How do you <u>know</u> what you <u>know</u>? Identifying and seeking information from the correct source is paramount.

Please take care if using these WhatsApp groups. WhatsApp groups can be great for helping to remind you of events or to get things done. However, sometimes though we find that this is not the sole purpose of the group.

Generically and historically, a small percentage of parents have used it to <mark>expres</mark>s their anger at decisions made, often without knowing the full situation. Furthermore, they can use it to discredit a situation based on a very individual and personal experience, and inaccurately generalise it to a wider area.

Worse still, parents can use it to blame other children unfairly. When this occurs, WhatsApp is unwelcome.

We believe it is unfair to use WhatsApp to question a person's ability and attempt, directly or inadvertently, to create a 'Mob Mentality' within the group against a person. I'm not sure any of us would like it if we were on the receiving end of this type of face-to-face conversation.

Aside from the inaccuracies and potential pitfalls, as WhatsApp is conversational based, families can miss important messages from the school. There is also the potential for accidental sharing/saving of personal images, documents or communications meant for a non-school based thread. For daily reminders of upcoming events, we encourage families to look back at the weekly newsletter or Seesaw announcements from the class teacher.

As a school, we are here to listen to families. We have many ways you can keep up to date and we welcome contact with families. We strongly suggest that if there is a question or an issue that you wish to raise then please raise it with the appropriate member of staff via email rather ethan posting your query on a social media. This will often yield a faster and more accurate response.



The Oryx Online Lead Practitioner Corner 22.09.23



Throughout this week the Primary School children have been very busy with their learning. Lots of activities in Maths, Science, English, Arabic, PE, Art, Music and Drama have been keeping everyone verg engaged with their learning.

In **Science lessons**, Year 1 have been learning about groups of animals and learning more about groups according to characteristics. Year 2 have been investigating why seeds are in fruits and vegetables and literally, with a microscope, taking a closer look why. Year 3 have also been looking at animals and food and deciding what we all need to be healthy and thriving. Year 4 have have been investigating electricity, specifically components in a circuit, with many lightbulb moments in class. Year 5 were creating videos utilising their knowledge of life cycles. Finally, Year 6 have been researching further about how and why we inherit some genetic traits and adapt from other to make us who we are. Check out the video below. In **English lessons**, classes in Year 3 and 4 have been bursting with enthusiasm and excitement as children orally retold their texts using Talk4Writing actions, enabling them to recall the key events. Year 1 have been busy sequencing the story, 'The tiger who came to tea', and Year 2 used 'hot seating' to find out and retrieve more information about characters. Year 5 revelled in creating exciting sentences using fronted adverbials, and Year 6 enjoyed researching & magpieing ambitious, exciting vocabulary from their class narrative to use in their own writing, including the word 'conspicuous'! See them in action below. In Maths lessons, year 3 had so much fun learning about one more and one less than a number, while year 5 got hands-on with number lines! Year 6 are challenging themselves at individual levels in their greater depth reasoning by using our new SVS greater depth reasoning prompts and using different representations to demonstrate their understanding and logical steps. We also started our Fun Maths Club ECA this week where we had so much fun working with lots of different manipulatives to consolidate our place value knowledge. We also learned a song to remember our 2x tables!




Miss Giles' Highlights





Miss Dye's Highlights



It has been another productive week in Year 4! We have definitely settled into the swing of things now and have really started to concentrate hard on our learning.




