## **PE and Swimming**

#### Highlight of the week: Year 1 PE

Students have been developing manipulation and coordination skills when using different types of balls.

They have been learning how to use equipment to perform actions as throw, catch, pass, space awareness, shoot and aim. Students have been introduced to simple game situations where they can apply learned skills. These are basic skills linked to all the PE topics.





#### Cross country and aquathon trials:

The PE department will be conducting trials for cross country and aquathon SVS squads during PE and swimming lessons from 2nd of October to 6th of October.

All students from Year 2 will participate in the Bleep test. This is a multi-stage fitness test used to estimate an athlete's aerobic capacity, that requires participants to run 15 (Y2, 3 & 4) or 20 metres (Y5 & Y6) back and forth across a marked track. The number of shuttles completed will be recorded as the score of the runner. Students will be selected by age group and gender.

In Maths this week, our Maths Champions have been working hard to plan our annual TT Rockstars dress up day which will be on Monday. We are very excited.
