As a learning support tool we encourage all of our learners to utilise the Atom online portal. Your child has a log in for the platform from their class teacher. They have assigned curriculum tasks to complete that incorporate English, maths and science. If you are unable to complete at home there is opportunity for your child to complete in school.

Throughout this week, our primary students have been excited with their new learning in all subjects areas starting the new mid term.

In science lessons, Key Stage One children have been asking many new questions about their new topics about different animals, ther features, how we group them and why. It will be exciting to see how these topics progress and listen to what the children have to say in the coming weeks. In Key Stage Two, the children have also started to pose new questions about rocks and soils, the digestive system, Earth and Space and animals and their native environments. With a busy half term ahead, I am sure our learners will have many insights into these new topics. In maths, students have been getting hands-on with addition and subtraction using concrete materials and real-life objects as tools to support learning and in real-life problem-solving. Year 6 students have been using fraction walls and tools to find equivalent fractions. Next week will be the start of Barvember where students will complete various bar model challenges throughout the month. Students have been working hard in class in October to use the bar model in their maths lessons to show their understanding with the hope of being one of the two students who will be chosen from each class from EYFS1- Year 6 to attend bar model workshops for Barvember. Our maths champions have been working hard on our Barvember activities. We are so excited! In English lessons this week, children have been continuing to explore Talk4Writing techniques to orally retell their stories using creative and exciting actions! Reading lessons have been buzzing, with year 5 exploring the skill of inference and deduction, and phonics has been buzzing across the EYFS and KS1 phases! Children have been extremely busy revising their spellings on Edshed ahead of our spelling bee, the amazing English champions have been spreading the exciting news this week. Class rounds will be on Monday 30th October, we can't wait!




### Mr Didcott's Highlights


