

Their efforts then took center stage in a fashion show, showcasing not only their imaginative designs but also fostering teamwork and an appreciation for sustainable innovation.













Science Updates

As part of our Science Focus week activities, some of our Year 9 students recently participated in an engaging Forensics Day. They were immersed in a simulated crime scene with evidence including blood, vomit, and hair (no actual living organisms were harmed for/during the event), students applied various forensics techniques, analysing evidence alongside suspect statements to deduce the criminal. This hands-on experience not only deepened their scientific understanding of content covered so far, but it also fostered teamwork and critical thinking skills.







Science Updates

In a dynamic hands-on session, our Year 9 students were tasked with the challenge of separating an unknown mixture and purifying water using limited equipment. Given the autonomy to select their apparatus, students made strategic choices and were required to stick to their selections. With a focus on critical thinking, they meticulously determined the order of techniques to maximise water purification, emphasising the importance of resourcefulness and problem-solving skills in scientific endeavours.







Science Updates

During Focus Week, our Year 10 students embraced a challenging titration practical, a method used to determine the concentration of a substance in a solution. This process involves the controlled addition of one solution to another until a chemical reaction is completed. This practical not only honed their lab skills but also highlighted the real-world applications of titrations in fields such as pharmaceuticals, environmental monitoring, and quality control, emphasizing the practical relevance of their scientific studies.



We arrived to our accommodation with beautiful scenery all around us.






Day 1 was all about our warm Sri Lankan welcome.

We spent the morning coconut painting and coconut leaf weaving then learned to surf in the afternoon.


We also visited a local school to learn about education there.
