





















We're thrilled to announce that Year 7 student Aamnah Hasan won an award at the DIAMUN Conference for her exceptional work on position papers.

As a school, we are incredibly proud of her achievement and look forward to seeing her future successes.




















Arabic Update – Mr. Kerba

Dear Parents,

I trust this message finds you well and safe. I am writing to inform you that South View School will be participating in the 8th edition of the Arab Reading Challenge (تحدي القراءة العربي).

All students are invited to take part in this competition. The essence of the competition revolves around reading and summarizing the content of the books in designated reading passports.

These passports vary based on the level of achievement reached by the student:

- Level 1: Red Passport
- Level 2: Green Passport
- Level 3: Gray Passport
- Level 4: Blue Passport
- Level 5 (the final level): Golden Passport

To progress to the next level, students must read and summarize 10 books in their passport. For Arabic B students to reach the final level, they are required to read a total of 25 books. For Arabic A students to reach the final level, they must complete all the passports across all levels.






## **BSME**
