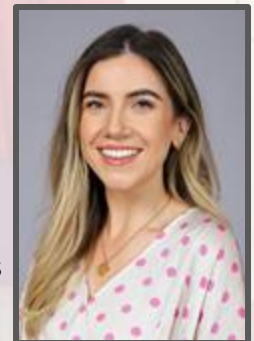

World Maths Day

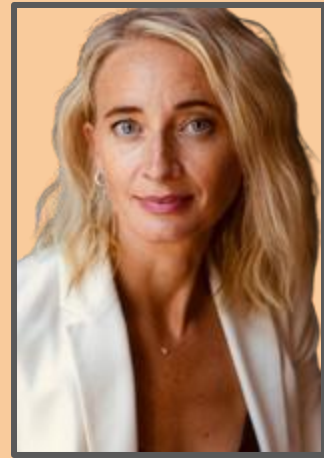

We linked our learning to science by exploring the patterns we could find in nature and discovered that lots of animals have very intriguing patterns. We then used patterns to create art work.

Another fabulous week in Year 1 has come to an end and our World Book Day celebrations were without a doubt the highlight of the week!

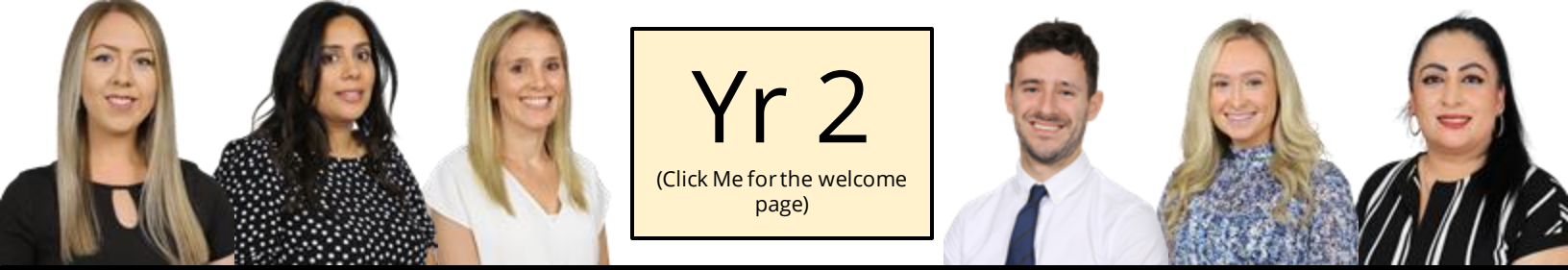

Y3 & Y4 athletics results:

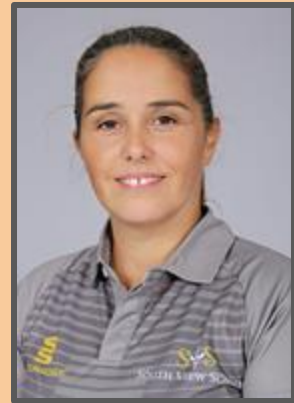
