This encourages children to use the bar model to calculate the answer to a Maths question. The bar model is a useful tool for helping children visualise and then solve Maths problems. Even some of the most complex problems can be solved when they're represented visually!

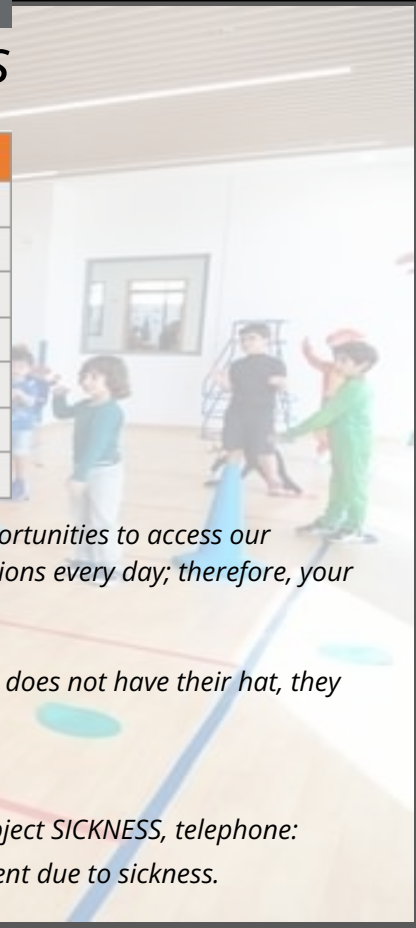

Try some of these simple activities at home to further support your child's speech and language development.

-Many simple boxed games can be adapted so that children are practising using their language – Mr Egg Head, Guess Who, Pop Up Pirate, etc.

-Books, books and more books! Read with your child, listen to audiobooks together, retell your favourite stories.

-Discuss a review of the day at home or bed time.

-Allow your child to help you with household chores, for example cooking dinner. Talk through what you are doing with your child.

-Do not always highlight incorrect speech but model back the correct response. For example, 'cat sit down'. 'Yes, the cat is sitting down on the chair!'

-Make comments not questions to encourage 2-way communication.
