New Measures

The following will be put in place to tackle the current peak traffic flow outside the school with the aim of speeding up the drop off of children, specifically in the morning.

1. School gates will open earlier at 0725 hrs daily.


Drop-off and Pick Up

- 2. An extended drop off area will be provided at the front of the school to enable a faster "drop and go" facility for older pupils and move much of the current parking immediately outside the school to the vacant parking spaces between Gates 3 and 5. This arrangement will also reduce the number of cars reversing out of the front of school parking area and interrupting the flow of traffic on the road.
- 3. Limit the access to and from the wasteland/surface parking area adjacent to Gate 1 so as to increase traffic flow on the road.
- 4. The police are being consulted with a view to providing additional support at key times.
- 5. Cars reversing out of spaces should obey the instructions of the traffic marshals as they are synchronising the movement of vehicles to ensure maximum traffic flow.

To improve traffic flow, families should follow the advice below:

If you need to park, please use the parking provided between Gates 3 and 5 if at all possible. The walking distance between this area and the EYFS classrooms is less than 1 minute longer than parking on the wasteland car park adjacent to Gate 1. If you are able to drop your children before 0740 hrs, please do so as traffic is lighter at this time.

Prioritising parking by Gate 5 OVER earlier parking will improve traffic flow. It is utilised well at pick-up, but not a drop-off. Parked cars should reverse across 1 lane only, and proceed to the end to turn around, to avoid blocking 2 lanes.

Music: To add expressive vocal sounds and body percussion to a story.


