
Mr. Holliday's Updates - Next week = WEEK 2

A warm welcome back after what I hope was a relaxing and enjoyable Eid Break filled with quality family time. Please allow me to share a couple of reminders to our road users.

Drop-Off

Drop-offs are smoother when road users:

- Prioritise the parking by Gate 5
- Drive in and reverse out of spaces
- Use the drop-off zone inside Gate 5



If families reverse into entrance traffic only and then proceed to turn around after Gate 5, rather than reversing across two lanes of traffic, congestion will ease.



This parking by Gate 5 should be prioritised to ease traffic flow.

Students know their school. Families of students in Year 3 and above should use the drop-off zone and allow their children to walk in. This will ease demandon parking spaces.

Whereas these assessments are formal, the need for accurate and authentic results is paramount. Results will be compared to previous Progress Test and CAT4 outcomes, where applicable.

Students will be prepared with some orientation on the testing website* the questions themselves reflect everyday learning at SVS.

*note - GL Progress Test assessments for FS2 and Years 1 are paper-based assessments only.

The assessments are deliberately staggered. They will start on the 23rd May and will be completed by Friday 17th June.

- Finishing assessments in the allotted time
- Engaging in group conversations with peers
- Completing simple tasks in the usual time
- Following multi-step instructions
- Copying from the whiteboard
- Solving mental problems in thei<mark>r</mark> head





GL Assessments continued

Summary:

CAT4 assessments (Cognitive Ability Tests) are International Standardised Tests that give an indication into a student's potential, strengths, and any possible barriers to learning. The School will use the data collated from these to adapt support, challenge and other teaching strategies.

GL Progress Tests - International Standardised tests that give a summative assessment of knowledge, skills and understanding in Mathematics, English, and Science. Individual results from these are tracked and compared each year to monitor progress.

Who will do what?

GL Progress Test Science (PTS) = Years 3, 4, 5, 6. They are not administered for the other EYFS or Primary year groups.

GL Progress Test Maths (PTM) = FS2 to Year 6. They are not administered for the FS1 students.

GL Progress Test English (PTE) = FS2 to Year 6. They are not administered for the FS1 students.
