Mr. Holliday's Thank You

I would like to publicly thank our teachers, our students and our families for supporting each other through the last two weeks. Thank you for trusting the school and for understanding the situation we, as a nation, are in. I, as well as the teachers and parents, wholeheartedly agree that we want the kids in school. We want them to have face-to-face instruction and opportunities for them to interact with their friends and specialist teachers. Although we, as a school, do our absolute best to replicate classroom instruction on a Zoom - it cannot replace being in the classroom with their teachers and friends.

We also want the children to be safe.

The DHA and KHDA have rigid, robust and secure guidelines in place - as do other businesses and industries - and we follow them with due diligence. This will, frustratingly, cause disruption for all of us - the same disruptions other businesses and industries will experience. Other schools will be operating under the same guidelines. If they are open - quite simply, their covid cases are different to ours. That may continue, it may not. It is important to recognise this is the first time in 2 years that we have had to close Year Groups. Our context, as a school being in the middle of an active and social community, brings other factors that schools where most students take a bus to school may not experience.



We want to avoid the spread of this highly transmissible and dangerous infection. We do everything we can to have the students on site and ultimately, the safety of the students and school community will always be our priority. **Please can we remind families to test if children are showing symptoms and report results promptly to the school without sending their child in. Families should keep students at home while waiting for PCR results.**

Yr 2 and above	If 3 or more students are positive in the class over the last 14 days	Close the class and switch all to distance learning	7 days from last reported positive case
Same Corridor/Floor	If more than 50% of total number of classes per corridor have 2 or more positive cases in the last 14 days	Close the corridor/floor and switch all classes to distance learning	7 days from last reported positive case

Please check your child has a change of clothes in their school bag in case of any accidents.

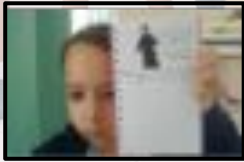
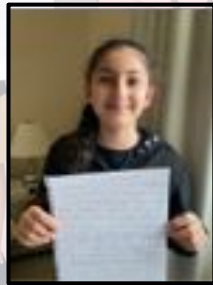
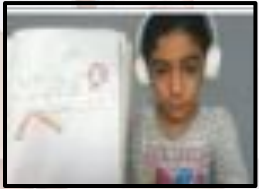

Dear Parents,

Drop-off and Pick Up

Thank you for your support and compliance with our traffic marshals as, in general, traffic is flowing well for most of the morning drop off period.

To make the process as safe and smooth as possible for all parents, I am once again circulating the traffic management diagram (attached below) for reference. With thanks to parents who are already doing this, please can I ask that:

1. You avoid parking, and use the drop off facility to drop your children as there are nannies on hand to lead young children to their classes if required. Older siblings may also escort their younger sibling to classes.
2. You drive into parking spaces forwards. The traffic marshals will then provide assistance with reversing back out onto the road. This saves time and allows us to manage and speed up the traffic flow.

SVS is planning to increase the capacity at the drop off facility so as to allow more vehicles to drop off simultaneously. More information will be shared as this facility becomes available.

Gates open from 7.25am. Registration starts from 7.40am, with the first lesson starting at 8.00am.

Dear Parents and Students,

This week in PE, while the restrictions on physical activities have been in place, we have continued our theory lessons and focused on the importance of keeping an active and healthy lifestyle.

Fitness and health related lessons in class

Our students have been learning how to identify factors that are important to keep a healthy lifestyle. They now understand the small steps that need to be done to follow the '5-2-1-0' practice daily. 5 stands for the number of vegetables and fruit that we should eat, 2 for 2 hours limit screen time, 1 stands for at least 1 hour of exercise and 0 for soft drinks. 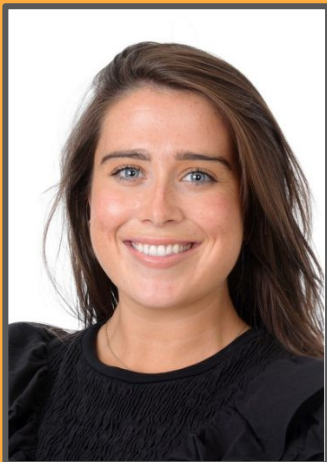
PE at home & PE Challenge of the day
