Pastoral Care and Well-being are at the forefront of all we do for our children, parents, staff and wider community. Our class teachers are compassionate and diligent, supported by our Heads of Years and Senior Leadership Team. Our Inclusion Team support the school across many aspects and we also have a school counsellor, Mrs. Deirdre Keane, on hand for further support and guidance. There are many strands to our care, with one being a PASS assessment. PASS is a GL self-assessment tool, required by the KHDA, which stands for 'Pupil Attitudes towards Self and School'. PASS is not a test, rather it is a questionnaire completed by children which ascertains their level of satisfaction with themselves as learners and with the school. The school will triangulate these outcomes with what class teachers observe on a daily basis and, if advisable, feedback from parents based on certain outcomes. Additional conversations can be held during the upcoming Parents Evening. The sign-up link will be shared via Seesaw when it is active and live.


